Reading

Psalm 1

- ¹ Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers,
- ² but whose delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night.
- ³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water,
- which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither—whatever they do prospers.
- ⁴ Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.
- ⁵ Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment,
- nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.
- ⁶ For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous,

but the way of the wicked leads to destruction.

Psalm 150

- ¹ Praise the LORD.
- Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens.
- ² Praise him for his acts of power; praise him for his surpassing greatness.
- ³ Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre,
- ⁴ praise him with timbrel and dancing, praise him with the strings and pipe,
- ⁵ praise him with the clash of cymbals, praise him with resounding cymbals.
- ⁶ Let everything that has breath praise the LORD. Praise the LORD.
